The mission of IAHCSMM is to promote patient safety worldwide by raising the level of expertise and recognition for those in the Central Service profession.


IAHCSMM accomplishes its mission:

Technical Document Types


What is an AAMI Standard

Provides recommendations regarding device labeling, basic safety and performance criteria and test methods for assessing compliance;

Provides guidelines for the use, care, evaluation, or processing of medical devices.

May be targeted at device manufacturers or health care personnel involved in using, maintaining, evaluating or processing a device





What is a TIR (Technical Information Report)

Review of important technical issues relevant to particular technology and statement of expert opinion

Issued when there is not sufficient data to develop a standard or consensus cannot be reached.

Allows discussion of several sides or positions related to an issues.



Who Writes the Standards?

Technical committees or working groups

Led by co-chairs—one producer and one general interest/user/regulatory representative

AAMI Committees—Membership balanced between users (clinicians), general interests, regulators and producers



- Last update 2017 (September)
- Known as the "Bible of Sterilization"
